#### Dear People and Friends of St. John's,

"O Come, O Come, Emmanuel!" For many of us, the hymn that carries those words into the air is ingrained in our souls, an iconic representation of the season of Advent. It speaks of a longing deep within us for what was promised: "Behold! The virgin will conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel – which means 'God with us.'" Yes, God with us. That is the promise; that is truth; and it is our deepest longing.

There is another hymn that expresses the same longing – although the words changed over the years and some people have come to use them in a pejorative way. One dictionary source says, "Rooted in an American spiritual and folk song of the same name, kumbaya refers, often disparagingly, to moments of or efforts at harmony and unity."

Yes, I'm laying "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" side by side with "Kumbaya" – and I can almost hear some people sneering. But stay with me.

The origin of Kumbaya – and its devolution – are laid out nicely in this article from NPR. Most likely, "kumbaya" is a transliteration of the plea for God to "come by here." Someone's crying, Lord – Come by here. The song came from the Gullah people of South Carolina and Georgia – not Europe. Its words are a transliteration from English, not Latin. But the heart-felt plea of "Come by here" echoes the same longing of "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel."

However we spend these days of Advent, whatever our plans for Christmas, and whatever words we choose – let us all pray: "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel!" "O Lord, Come by here!"

Have a most blessed Advent – and a love-filled Christmas.

#### Minutes for Vestry Meeting for November 2022

Present: Pat Thurston, Diane Stier, Olivia Ohler, Jerry May, Clancy Delong, DJ Proctor, Tom Cochrane, Alice Ciccu, Ulana Klymyshyn, Nancy Herman-Kinney, Mary Kiesgen, Dan Eichinger Absent – excused: Jen Dingman

Meeting opened with prayer at 7:02pm.

Pat led the opening prayer. Diane acted as Clerk. Nancy led the meeting.

Minutes from October meeting were reviewed. No changes suggested.

Olivia moved to accept minutes as written. Pat 2nd. All approved.

#### **Property Committee**

- Rectory foundation work is completed. Next job is to repair the steps at the front door of the church and expand the columbarium foundation for the two new units.
- Digital sign Committee is still working on this.

#### Worship Committee

- Committee met November 14.
- Family/Youth Services
  - Discussed youth involvement, other churches have youth services, music and lectors led by young members. Possibly in a family potluck/evening prayer format. Suggested the next Family Potluck/Evening Prayer be in Feb around Valentine's Day. The Hart family volunteered to lead the Valentine's Day worship service. Jen (Social) to coordinate the potluck.
- Worship Committee will narrow its focus in 2023 to get family potluck/evening prayer services off to a good start.
- Committee will continue to watch/visit other parishes to get ideas. It was suggested that we ask families what they would like to see. Devote some time to this during the annual meeting.
- Choral Evensong scheduled Dec 11th at 4pm. Wedding at the 10 AM service. No potluck that day.
- December 18th will be Greening Potluck to follow?

#### **Outreach Committee**

 2 families for Thanksgiving baskets. Olivia reported that the congregation stepped up and provided everything requested plus more. Nancy and Matthew delivered those this afternoon. Thanks to Nancy for stepping up when Olivia was recovering.

#### Minutes for Vestry Meeting for November 2022

• Restoration House was here Nov 13-20. The week went well. Ulana reported that we had a smaller group than usual – not more than 15 people any day, while in the past we have had 25-30. It was the decision of the ICRH to have people sleep in the undercroft and small rooms only, which limited the number. Parish hall wasn't used for sleeping because the guests reported there was too much light, noise, and lack of privacy. Tension rods and black-out curtains for future? Ulana, DJ, Laura and Alice will debrief. 2nd host week is March 26. Committee will come back to Vestry with a proposal for March.

#### **Education Committee**

- Diane ordered Advent booklets from Living Compass that we've used before. They will be sent directly to homebound parishioners and the rest made available to the congregation in the Narthex.
- Mary Ellen has also written materials for use by families that are printed as a booklet.

#### Parish Life/Social Committee

Diane will discuss with Jen about having a meal after the Greening on the 18th, instead of on the 11th
 and having the normal reception after Advent Lessons and Carols.

#### Administrative Committee

- 53 pledge cards sent out \$173,000 in estimated giving can add another ~\$7000 (\$5000 more than last year). 16 have not been returned so there is opportunity to get a bit more, but Clancy noted that probably only two or three and those have already been included in the estimated amount.
- Rummage sale proceeds previously voted to move those to the sign budget but as the sign is now delayed, the committee thinks it should stay as part of the operating budget. Clancy explained to Dan that that there was a positive balance when he suggested moving the money originally and now there is a deficit. It was suggested that if we are projecting to finish with a deficit it might make sense to move it for the upcoming fiscal year. It was noted that we pay back the diocese 12% of our budget, which comes out of our operating budget. Funds for capital projects are not subject to this percentage. It was suggested that the funds be used for outreach in the future. This may motivate volunteers and buyers.
- Need a motion to move the residuals from the carpet and the sound project (totaling about \$100) to the sign fund. [NOTE: This will be on the December agenda.]
- Rector's housing allowance and salary need approval. Diocese has increased the minimum by 5%.
   Suggests that while trying to maintain cost of living, parishes make it up later, if possible.
- Electric and Gas Clancy will need to estimate new rates, based on current costs and estimated usage.
- Important note when we look at the budget, we must keep in mind what we are here for.

#### Minutes for Vestry Meeting for November 2022

#### Pastoral Report

- Diocesan Convention was Oct 28/29 and for the first time, all delegates were available. Lara Raisanen also attended as Northern Region member of the diocesan Advisory Council.
  - Bishop is working to get key groups/committees from both dioceses to work more closely together in 2023.
- Christmas Eve service time and the use of candles on Christmas Eve were discussed.
- End of Life planning several 2-hour sessions on Sundays after coffee hour, Diane to propose dates. Could we have estate planning included? Remind parishioners that they can include St John's in their wills. There is a checkbox for that on the online giving site, but no one has used it. Clancy suggested David Kerr to give a presentation on this.

#### New Business

- Planning for the coming year? Suggested having a mini-2-hour retreat in the Parish Hall
- Vestry membership? Tom, Nancy, and Ulana are going off, Ulana and Tom will serve on the nominating committee.

Next meeting Sunday Dec. 11 at 11:30 AM in the rectory.

Pat led the closing prayer.

Tom motioned; Nancy seconded. Meeting adjourned at 8:37 pm

Sound/Video System: All expenses for the project have been paid

External Sign Upgrade: Whittemore Foundation grant request has been approved. The

sign committee is creating a proposal to send to additional vendors. Grants and funds collected account for \$13,392.50

being raised to date.

Columbarium Expansion: The proposal for the expansion of our columbarium has been

approved. This will provide two additional units; 48 niches. A

check in full has been issued, giving us a 3% discount.
