Outside the Tent

Henry and I have just returned from Montreal, where he attended a professional meeting. I visited a genealogical library to check a document, and the McCord Museum to see "Wearing Our Identity: The First Peoples Collection," a stunning exhibit of clothing, jewelry, purses, and other assorted objects. The collection encompasses all the indigenous tribes of Canada, including the Mi'kmaq, who gave me two grandmothers, daughters of the chief who married French men, in the seventeenth century. I lingered over the tiny beaded caps for their babies, the Basque-like hats given to girls when they reached womanhood, and the nineteenth-century men's dress robes that imitated European military uniforms of the period. There are, of course, no photographs of Mi'kmaq women and men of the seventeenth century, but their exquisite work conjured up for me a creative, skillful people. And the exhibit got me thinking about a poem I wrote twelve years ago for Racism and Prayer, a Morehouse publication in 2003. Back then I didn't know I had First Nation ancestry, but I was painfully aware of the pockets of racism that still resided in me, especially toward Native Americans. I read the poem over, something I haven't done in years, and while I think it could use some editing—I did do a bit!—I am struck by the final verse:

Be with me, Creator of all these beautiful people,

as I move from the middle of my journey into its endings.

Stretch my narrow heart and mind....

Oh, how my Creator is stretching my heart and mind! Norman Massey said famously that we only change when we have a "significant emotional experience," and I see now that this is mine. And I am thankful.

Journey and Confession

In the beginning, Sister Marie Josetta taught us gently that we are all your children.

But I confess to you, my Maker, that in the northwoods of 1954—where Lutherans and Methodists were heathens in my world; where Finns filled in for Poles in heartless jokes; where Indians were not the noble people whose arrowheads my father found in childhood fields, but penniless men who staggered into ER on Saturday night; where Jews were the misguided race who killed my Savior, arrogant east coast city boys who filled my father's harangues of life in the Army barracks—

I lived in a daydream, never thinking that her gentle teaching of your love extended far beyond the hallways of my school, beyond the streets of my small white town.

In fifth grade, our teacher nudged us beyond ourselves to correspond with children in the tobacco country of North Carolina.

But I confess to you, my Maker, that in my northwoods town—where African Americans never walked the streets, but carried my bags and served my sandwiches on the Streamliner to Chicago—I reeled when my penpal sent me a picture of her class, smiling black children all.

Where is that photograph now, where the smudged fifth-grade handwriting of her letters?

Where is she now, a woman in middle-age, who shook me briefly from my monochromatic world?

And now, many miles from my northwoods beginnings, settled into land peopled by farmers of hardy German and Irish lineage—with a Native American casino gnawing at the edges of our fragile tolerance; with a world no longer white crashing into my consciousness every night on the evening news—I marvel at the beauty of the people you have made, and yet I confess to you, my Maker, that I am only at the middle of my journey, that pockets of resistance deep inside surprise me when I think I've sprung loose from the provincial heart inherited from my home, from my nation, from my church.

Be with me, Creator of all these beautiful people, as I move from the middle of my journey into its endings.

Stretch my narrow heart and mind, prod my lagging step, and comfort me with your forgiveness when I slip back toward habits I don't always want to leave behind.

September 2025 Financial Report – Evangel Enclosure

Below is a summary of operating fund activity through the end of September (75.00%).

Operating fund receipts over (under) expenditures \$ (21,236.78)

Through September, income remains down. Excluding the audit, our income is down nearly \$11,000. Please verify that your estimated giving amount is up-to-date.

We have paid \$9,500 toward the audit thus far. The audit is funded by prior years' surplus. The audit should be completed in early November.

The Stewardship Campaign for estimated giving amounts shall commence on October 26th. Estimated giving cards are due back to Pamela Dingman by Sunday November 9th. Active participation is needed for St. John's to maintain its wonderful programs.

Has anyone noticed the new website!?! I am very excited to announce that we were awarded a Grant from the Diocese's Digital Ministry Taskforce to upgrade our outdated website! The Digital Ministry Grant is designed to "help congregations deepen our digital presence – to make it more engaging, accessible, and sustainable. To remain relevant, accessible, and invitational for generations to come, our congregations must continue to invest in digital platforms as vital spaces for ministry."

We won one last year that we used to install a speaker in the nursery so people who need to use it during the service can still hear everything in the sanctuary.

This year it came around again, and I submitted a grant to upgrade our website. It was in bad need of a refresh and the current platform it is on is not being actively supported. We used the grant money for a web developer to move to a better technical platform and give us an improved design.




St. John's Choir
