Dear People of St. John's and Friends,

Some of this message is a "repeat" of things I've said before - but it bears repeating.

June was a busy month...lots going on in the community as well as at St. John's. We started with the Day of Honoring, Healing, and Remembering with the tribe. Then came PRIDE Fest in Mt. Pleasant, the Juneteenth celebration at Island Park, Jess Hart's graduation from the Academy of Vocational Leadership, and finally our first PRIDE Communion in the parish hall, where 40 people came to celebrate Eucharist together!

St. John's... the parish – the church – is more than what happens within the walls of the church (or the parish hall). As we hear in this Sunday's Gospel passage (Luke 10:1-11, 16-20), Jesus sends us out – to carry his mission into the world. He commissions us to preach and heal – to bring the good news – to those outside our walls... and that means we need to be present in the community.

We go to graduation parties, we celebrate retirements and birthdays and anniversaries of folks in the parish, to let one another know that they matter to us – that we care for and celebrate with them. But if we are to be church, if we are serious about what we say – that everyone is our sister and brother – then we also need to be present to care for and celebrate others – in the community around us.

And that is why we go to PRIDE celebrations and Juneteenth festivals and days of Remembrance for our Indigenous siblings. We go to be present – to honor and celebrate and care for those we say are welcome in our St. John's house.

Our presence matters to people. Folks noticed that St. John's had a presence at the Juneteenth celebration, at the PRIDE event in town, and at the day of Honoring, Healing and Remembering for the tribe. Our presence tells people that we care enough to be there – and that might be the encouragement they need to dare to believe they might really be welcome at St. John's.

I wear my collar most of the time I'm in town. I never wore a "habit" in my earlier days, because I saw that as a way of being 'set apart' or special, and I did not want to communicate that message. But I wear my collar (and usually a St. John's button) now as I'm out and about – to let people know that St. John's is present and available. We fly the Episcopal Church Flag, the PRIDE flag, and a Red Dress* from the front of the rectory/office. Yesterday I had a wonderful conversation with someone for whom the Red Dress* was significant. Sometimes it's the PRIDE flag or the Black Lives Matter sign.

St. John's is the church – yes. But we can only fully be church when we extend ourselves and our welcome beyond our doors.

Remember that you are loved - and so is everyone else you will meet.

*The Red Dress Project seeks to honor and raise awareness about missing and murdered indigenous people and began in 2010 after artist Jamie Black launched her continuing REDress art installation. In Mt. Pleasant, we celebrated the National Day of Remembrance for Missing and Murdered Indigenous People on May 5 – and we keep the Red Dress hanging as a sign that we continue to remember.

New Assisting Bishop Rt. Rev. Anne Hodges-Copple



Dear friends in Christ,

On behalf of the Standing Committee, I am overjoyed to share that the Rt. Rev. Anne Hodges-Copple will be joining the staff of the Diocese of the Great Lakes as our Assisting Bishop beginning in mid-August.

Bishop Anne brings a wealth of experience, deep pastoral wisdom, and a joyful spirit of accompaniment to this role. She served faithfully for nine years as Bishop Suffragan of the Diocese of North Carolina, and while she has officially retired from full-time episcopal ministry, she continues to answer God's call to serve the Church. We are honored that she has said yes to joining us.

Bishop Anne will serve quarter time through April 2027, when we will consecrate our first Bishop Diocesan. Although she will not reside in Michigan, she will make regular trips to the diocese. She is already working closely with our staff to explore creative ways of being present with and accessible to across our communities on site and online.

This announcement is a long time coming! Since June 2024, your Standing Committee has been actively seeking an Assisting Bishop to offer pastoral and episcopal leadership during this time of transition. As you've heard me and others say many times before, we know that our systems and our people work best with a bishop walking alongside us. Our Interim Executive Officer, Alan James, is providing excellent administrative and structural leadership and we're thankful now that Bishop Anne will join us in a role focused on uniquely episcopal leadership.

We are confident that Bishop Anne is the right person to walk with us in this season. Much like an interim rector serves a parish in transition, she will tend to the spiritual and pastoral life of our diocese as we continue our search for the person God is calling to be our first Bishop Diocesan.

Bishop Anne is eager to get to know the people of the Great Lakes and to share in ministry with us. She brings a particular heart for connection, formation, and care. She has already expressed her commitment to being a pastoral and teaching presence throughout our diocese and looks forward to joining us at Diocesan Convention this October.

We'll be sharing more details about her schedule, availability, and ways to connect in the coming weeks. For now, please join me in giving thanks for this good news, and in prayer for Bishop Anne as she prepares to step into this role among us.

Meeting called to order:

Opening Prayer by Stier

Administrative Business

- Motion to approve minutes from the 16 March 2025 meeting by DeLong; Thurston second. Motion passed unanimously.
- Vestry approves budgeted expenditure from computer & technology for a new Rectory computer, not to exceed \$850.
- Information: The generous special gifts to St. John's are specific to the music program but the donors placed no other restrictions.
- Ethan Kindle discussed growing St. John's choir; Vestry commented that a Thursday, 4:00 pm rehearsal is not workable for parishioners with 9-5 jobs.
- Vestry will place a call for volunteers (audit; counting receipts) into This Week and the Evangel. It was mentioned that counting after church on Sunday likely would be more convenient for a larger pool of volunteers.
- Eichinger, Raisanen, and Thurston agreed to be audit volunteers

Pastoral Report

- Continuing supper church through the summer
- In June, St. John's needs volunteers to attend PRIDE celebration (7th), Indigenous People's Day of Remembrance (6th), and Juneteenth (tbd)
- The Rev. Canon Nurya Love Parish (EDGL Canon for Beloved Community) asked Sr. Diane to participate on an Indigenous Boarding School reflection committee. She agreed to represent St. John's as a parish-at-hand where one of the Indigenous Boarding Schools was located.
- The Rev. Linnea Stiffler will be supply priest on 22 June 2025
- Jess Hart will be ordained a Transitional Deacon on 12 July and will preach at St. John's on 13 July.
- The Mountaintown Family Chorus will perform at the Isabella County Commission on Aging this Wednesday, 21 May 2025 at 7:00 pm.

Minutes for Vestry Meeting for Sunday, February 16, 2025

Committee Reports

- A. Building and Grounds
 - 1. Motion to accept a contract with Grass Wackers, Inc. for an amount not to exceed \$2,400 for calendar year 2025 by Raisanen; Antwi second. Motion passed unanimously.
 - There was discussion on capping lawn care costs, which have increased with the need to procure new providers. Vestry discussed a reasonable allowance for GWI taking into account our separate contracted costs with Neat & Green.
 - The goal is to keep costs as low as possible but also to give the Junior
 Warden leeway to spend the required funds to keep the lawn and grounds well-maintained.
 - 2. A separate contract with Neat & Green for lawn treatment was approved previously.
- B. Worship no report
- C. Human Resources committee will meet within next month
- D. Administration & Finance
 - 1. Receipts are low should be at 33% for the year; we are not quite there.
 - 2. Utilities budget is likely insufficient due to unexpected increased costs; Vestry must watch these line items closely.
 - 3. CD interest income is outperforming budget, due to both increased amounts held as well as particularly strong interest rates.
 - 4. DeLong will create a short-term CD for the special gift money.
 - 5. Kindle says sanctuary can be kept at 60F in winter and up to 70F in summer with no harm to the organ.
 - 6. St. John's is grateful to the anonymous donor who paid for the bat remediation.
 - 7. Motion by Raisanen; second by Thurston to accept treasurer's report.
 Motion passed unanimously.

 - The St. John's Vestry approves the letter written by Christi Brookes to the Mount Pleasant School Board for submission to their meeting record and minutes, and also approves her presenting on our behalf at the meeting.

May 2025 Financial Report

Below is a summary of operating fund activity through the end of May (41.67%).

Through the first five months of 2025, income remains down. As we did in 2024, we adopted a budget with a deficit in 2025. The 2025 budgeted deficit is \$18,426.44. My main concern is through the first five months in 2024, we had some movement in covering the shortage. Unfortunately, that is not the case in 2025. This weight is not to be place on parishioners alone. We are in a tough economy right now. With the economic woes we are currently facing, it's difficult to cover a balanced budget, let alone a deficit budget.

Good News Garden


